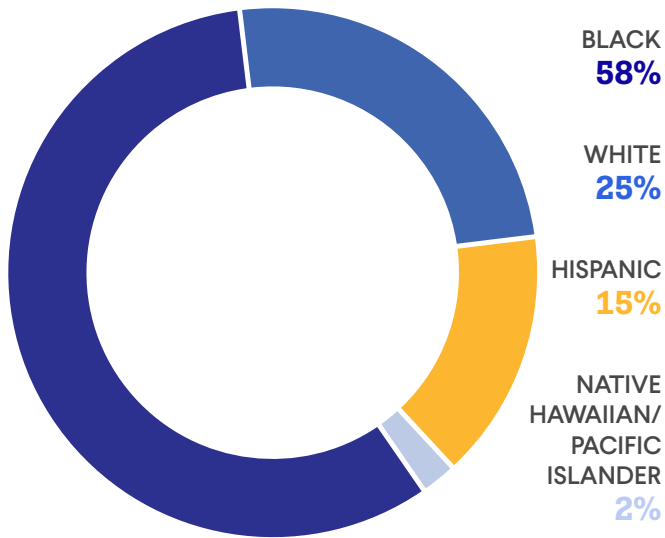

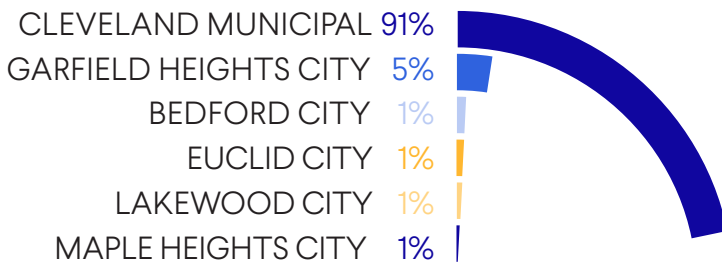

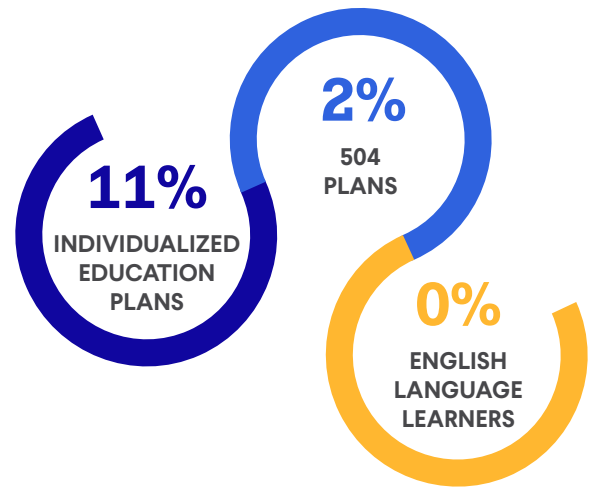
DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE

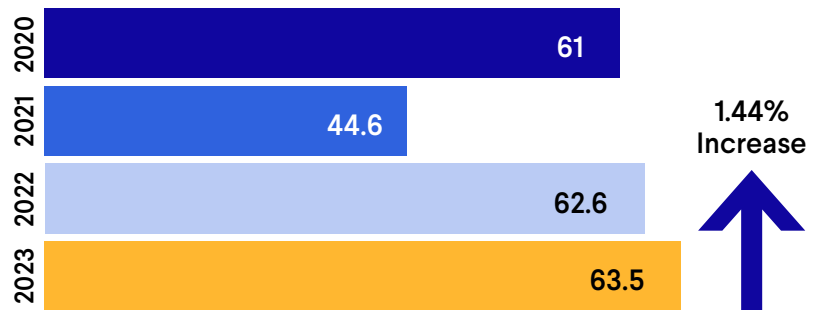

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students, instructional hours above state requirements, and targeted academic interventions, Constellation Schools: Eastside Arts Academy continues steady academic recovery coming out of the pandemic. The school achieved a Performance Index (PI) score increase year-over-year and additionally exceeded state expectations (3.5 Stars Overall & 4 Stars Gap Closing).
