

#### STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS




AVERAGE DAILY ENROLLMENT


#### DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE






#### **ACADEMIC PROGRESS**

Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students, instructional hours above state requirements, and targeted academic interventions, Constellation Schools: Eastside Arts Academy continues steady academic recovery coming out of the pandemic.
