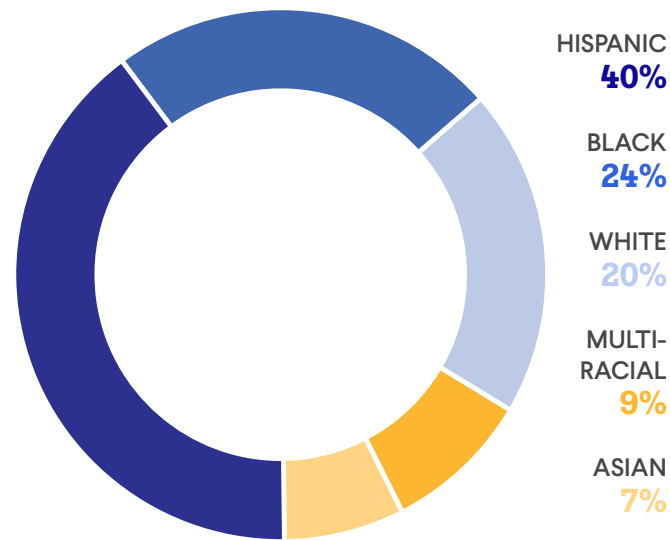

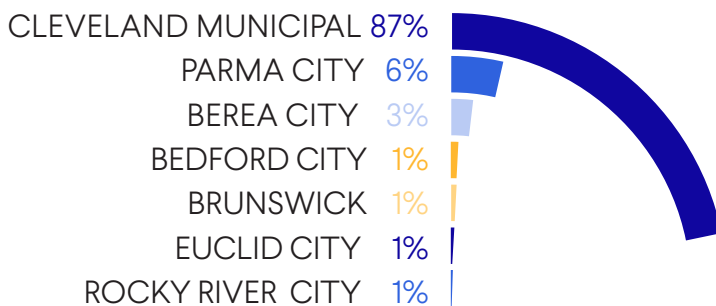

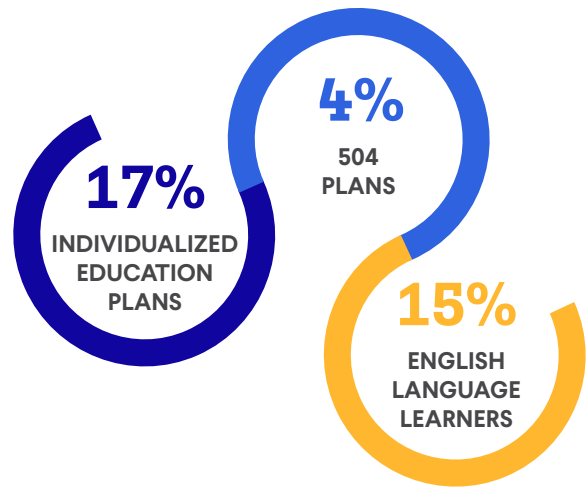
DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE

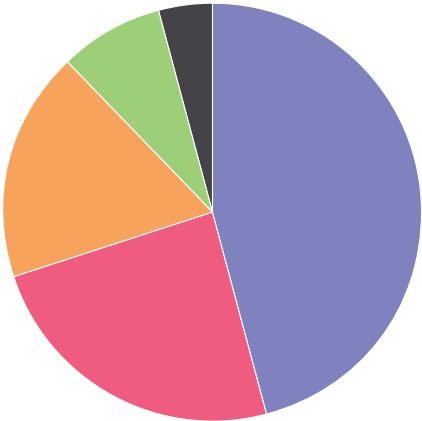
ACADEMIC PROGRESS
